The Kentucky Slave Stampede.—The Maysville Eagle makes the following notice of the Slave trial progressing in Bracken county, Kentucky:—

The Grand Jury found a true bill against seven of the slaves in Bracken county for the outrage committed there. One bill for conspiracy, insurrection and rebellion, and one for shooting with intent to kill. Upon the first, a jury was obtained on Tuesday, and the trial is now progressing. Two negroes occupied nerely five hours in testifying, since which, half a dozen white men have testified in relation to the resistance and firing by the company of negroes, upon the white men who attempted to take them up as runaway slaves. The jury is composed of good men of Bracken county selected at a called term, and not by Commissioners, as at a general term.
