ANOTHER SLAVE STAMPEDE IN KENTUCKY.
The Maysville Herald of Wednesday week, mentions the discovery and frustration of another negro stampede in Kentucky. Some forty slaves, it says, belonging in Woodford county, had made arrangements to break the bonds of servitude and seek the sweets of liberty in a free State, on Saturday. The negroes all had free passes, and according to general orders were each to steal a horse and thus ride out of the land of bondage. But one of the band proving recreant, their designs were discovered and frustrated.
