NEGRO STEALING.—We learn from the Des Moines Valley Whig, that a number of abolitionists reciding at Salem, lows, recently stole nine negroes from a Mr. Daggs, of Clark county, in this state. They were pursued and captured by the owner and some of his friends, who, on their way back to Clark county, were, in turn, mobbed by superior numbers of abolitionists, and their slaves again set free. On last Wednesday, about one hundred men, all armed, started from Farmington, Misseum, for Salem, Iowa, and we shall in all probability soon hear of the recapture of the negroes, or the arrest of the abolitionists, and probably some bloodshed; which generally so companies such lawless acts.—St. Louis Reveille.
