A SLAVE STAMPEDE. — We understand that fourteen negroes, male and female, belonging to Mrs. Pendleton, of Hagerstown, and hired out at different places in the country, ran away on Saturday night last, to Pennsylvania. A reward of four hundred dollars is offered for their apprehension, and a number of persons, who do not "*loathe*" the Fugitive Slave Law, are in hot pursuit of them.

P. S. — These Slaves were captured at Harrisburg and were confined in the jail at that place.
