SIXTEEN HUNDRED DOLLARS REWARD!!

 RAN AWAY from the subscribers on the night of the 4th inst., the following slaves: B. BARD, a bright mulatto boy, tall and good looking; speaks French and English, aged about twenty six years, and belongs to Lewis V. Borg, of Ste Genevieve.

Henri, also a bright mulatto, rather small, but very active; speaks French and English, aged about eighteen years, and belongs also to Lewis V. Borg.

Joseph, a red mulatto, tall and slender; speaks French and English, aged from twenty-six to twenty-eight years, belongs to Antoine James, of Ste Genevieve.

Theodore, a mulatto; short and stumpy, with downcast look, speaks French and English; aged twenty three to twenty five years belongs to Nere Vallé of Ste Genevieve.

Edmund a black man stout and well-set, with a defect in one eye; aged about thirty-seven to forty years, and belongs to William Skewes of Ste Genevieve.

On the same night, from Valle & Mines, Missouri, the following boys ran away:

Isaac a black man; slim, and about 5 feet 6 to 7 inches high; has a peculiar walk, aged from thirty-two to thirty seven years, speaks French and English, and belongs to Felix Vallé, of Ste Genevieve.

Joseph, a mulatto boy; slim and tall, speaks French and English, and squints; a good looking fellow, aged twenty-two to twenty-four years, and belongs to Felix Vallé.

Lill a black man, about 5 feet 10 inches high, stout built, full eyes, stammers when interrogated; aged twenty-four to twenty-five years and belongs to Jonathan Smith, residing near Valle & Mines, in Jefferson county, Missouri.

A reward of sixteen hundred dollars will be paid for the apprehension and delivery in any jail in Missouri of all of the above boys or of two hundred dollars for the apprehension and delivery of any one of them.
