FLGITIVE SLAVES.—The Cilcinnati Gazette states that the nice Fugitive Slaves, seized near that city on Wednesday hight last, wore from Boone County, Ky., and on their way to Canada. They were on foot, their baggage on their backs; their clothing torn and ragged, and their appearance deplorable. Four of them were men, two women, and three children. They will probably be remanded to Slavery, and like Burns, who was "so glad to get back" to Maryhand, "sent further South to a new Market "

On the night previous to the above attest, the Gazette says that 23 slaves made a "stampede" from Ky, reached the Licking River; lashed together several cances and descended the Licking to the Ohio river, disembarked near Cincinnati and on Wedne-day morning were run off, by the underground railroad to Canada.
