STAMPEDE OF SLAVES.—During last Tuesday night twenty-three negroes, owned in Grant and adjoining counties, left their masters' roofs, and escaped to the Licking river, where they lashed together several canoes, and in disguise they rowed down the Licking river to the Ohio and crossed, where they disembarked and made a circuitous route to the northern part of Cincinnati. Early on Wednesday morning they were run off on the route to Canada by the underground railroad.—Louisville Journal.
