NEGRO REVOLT .- We have a letter of November 2d, from Mr. Graves, a postmaster letsville, Lavaca county, (says the Ga Civilian of the 11th) in which he says that on of the men implicated by Davidson in roposed negro stampede, were not found or at least his testimony was regarded as value, from conflicting with his former ments. The parties accused, however, we're released on condition that they should leave the county in forty-eight hours. Davidson received one hundred lashes and orders to leave the county in twenty-four hours. One of the parties attempted to be implicated by Davidson, named Hefferman, was not included in the order to leave, and is not suspected. The others were men of doubtful character.
