Reported Insurrection at Harper's Ferry. Fraderick City and Baltimore dispatches of the 17th give conflicting accounts of an insurrection at Harper's Ferry. One is that an armed band of abolitionists have full possession of the U. S. Arsenal; that an express train had been fired into; that a negro was killed in getting the train through; that a wagon load of rifles had been sent into Maryland; and that a mobited by about 250 whites with a gang of negroes were fighting. The Baltimore dispatch says the affair is greatly exaggerated. The difficulty occurred at the armory, and the negroes have nothing to do with it. The train due at Baltimore carly in the morning was detained, and many wild rumors were affoat, among others that there had been a stampede of negroes from Maryland.
