

THE NORTHAMPTON REPORT.—The report of a slave stampede to come off in Northampton county, Va., to day, originated from an anonymous letter received by Mr. Raleigh, of that county, in which "A Friend of Humanity" states that an attempt will be made at four places on the Eastern shore of Virginia, to-day one of them being Punguteague to free the slaves and send them off to Canada. Col. Munford, Secretary of State, has telegraphed to Norfolk to send 300 muskets, with ammunition, to Col. Finney, of Accomac.

In Charlottesville, a man from the North, named Rood, has been arrested on suspicion, and papers found on him sufficiently important to warrant his imprisonment. In Danville a clerk at the Post-Office saw a man throw a letter, which he had just gotten, into the stove, and taking it out, found it to be a proposition for running off slaves. The man was arrested.—*Richmond Dispatch.*
