## Immense Rush of Negross to Fortress Montee.

A dispatch from Fortress Monroe, dated July 26th, says:

It became apparent, early last evening, that the rebels meditated an attack on Hampton. General Butler determined to abandon the town in case of a formidable advance, and at seven o'clock the order was given for families and goods to be removed. Within one hour orders were also issued to burn the town rather than have it tall into the hunds of the enemy. The General well understands that the possession of Hampton by the rebals will be of no particular importance.

A stampede of the colored population took place all night, and to day the road has been lined with refugers to the fortress, and army wagens and carts bringing in goods from Hempten. The road has presented a most remarkable appearance; nearly 1,00 contraband man, women and children must have come in during the last twenty four hours. For the present those not encomped in the F rirees, will be in and around the seminary building, lately the headquarters of Colonci Duryees.
